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How to Play the Game

Preparation - When preparing for this game make sure your have the following materials ready:

Word Cards (These need to be posted on a wall or whiteboard) Flyswatters (Preferable the clean kind)

You might also like to have a tape line which the students would need to stand behind before you start reading the word clue.

Game Play

- 1. Divide the class in half
- 2. Have two students from each team stand side by side in front of the whiteboard.
- 3. After you start to read a definition to a word the first student to hit the correct vocabulary word with their flyswatter earns a point for their team.
- 4. Switch players and continue until all of the vocabulary words have been used or until a certain number of points has been reached.

Introducing New Vocabulary Words

Vocabulary instruction should be a part of any reading program but often it is found to be pushed aside or missing completely. This e-book will provide you with a resource to provide a fun, and engaging activity that will help your students to expand their vocabularies.

This e-book is geared toward one vocabulary game, but an effective vocabulary program will not only include games but will include a description or explanation of key vocabulary terms, a chance for students to restate the description in their own words, students will be able to draw or visually represent the word, activities and discussions. These six steps are taken from Marzano's Building Academic Vocabulary (2005).

To help your students get the most from their excitement about playing the Flyswatter Vocabulary Game I've also included in this e-book, some graphic organizers with a flyswatter theme, and some practice sheets to get your students to familiarize themselves with the vocabulary words before playing the game.


What you will find in this e-book


